Institutional Aid

Colleges use FAFSA[®] to determine financial need for need-based scholarships.

- Harford Community College awards approximately \$1 million in grants and scholarships each year.
- Colleges may offer both need-based scholarships and non-need-based scholarships such as merit scholarships.

Applying For Scholarships at Harford

Application Checklist:

- FAFSA for year you are applying
- Transcript: High school or college transfer students
- Narrative/Essay

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Letters of recommendation

READ THE SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS CAREFULLY. Some scholarships require a separate application, additional narratives, letters of recommendation and/or a personal interview.

APPLICATION SUBMISSION CHECKLIST:

2021-2022 FAFSA results must be on file in the Financial Aid Office for greater scholarship eligibility.

TRANSCRIPT (graduating high school seniors or college transfer students): Current HCC students do not need to submit a transcript. Please note: 2021 high school graduates do not need to provide a final transcript by the scholarship deadline but are encouraged to submit a final transcript upon graduation. OFFICIAL transcripts from ALL previous colleges attended should be submitted to HCC.

□ NARRATIVE / ESSAY:

Type a brief narrative/essay through the on-line application. Be sure to:

- 4. Include your name and Harford ID#.

Submit all other materials specifically required for any scholarship/grants for which you are applying with this application (i.e., letters of recommendation, additional narrative(s), etc.) as requested during the application process. Failure to do so may eliminate you from consideration for a scholarship.

Academic dishonesty, which includes cheating, fabrication, facilitating academic dishonesty, plagiarism and copyright infringement, is a violation of Harford Community College's Code for Student Rights, Responsibilities and Conduct. Students who commit an act of academic dishonesty while applying for a scholarship, including HCC scholarships, HCC Foundation scholarships, or private scholarships, may have their application invalidated and/or may be subject to disciplinary action.

Things to keep in mind when applying for scholarships

- There are approximately 150 scholarships that you can apply for using just **ONE** online application.
- Make sure to complete the **ENTIRE** application, including letters of recommendation and/or special essays, if instructed to provide either.
- Don't wait until the last day or two to apply. If recommendations are needed, there's not enough time to notify and receive recommendations from instructors, especially during finals week. Be courteous of an instructor's time as they are very busy.

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What happens after you submit your application

- Award notices are delivered to a student's campus email address.
- Students are only notified if they DO receive an award.
- There is no timeframe for when scholarship recipients receive award notices.
- For various reasons, scholarship committees meet at different times throughout the semester. Students do not receive a decline message because the committee selections are ongoing.
- The Fall 2021 online application will be available MAR 15 through MAY 15.

MHEC also administers state financial aid programs that affect students on a statewide basis.

MDCAPS (MD College Aid Processing System)

- Establish a login and password on MDCAPS website.
- Accept your grant(s) and tell the state the school you want to receive your grant(s).
- Will receive 3 emails and/or texts from state before grant is canceled.
- You have about 4 weeks to accept grant.

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If you don't accept your grant, it will be canceled by the state and you
may go on a waitlist.

Rawlings Assistance Grant

- Complete the FAFSA® or MSFAA by MAR 1 every year.
- If a student is ineligible to file a FAFSA[®] application but eligible for in-state tuition, complete the MSFAA by MAR 1 online through MDCAPS.
- Student must be eligible for in-state tuition.

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• Student must enroll at a two-year or four-year Maryland college or university as a full-time (12+ credits per semester), degree-seeking, undergraduate student.

 Students must demonstrate financial need. All applicants are ranked by Expected Family Contribution (EFC). (Students with the lowest EFC are awarded first).

• Grant is renewable when FAFSA[®] is completed by MAR 1 each year.

 Must maintain minimum satisfactory academic progress.

Guarantee Access Grant

- Complete the FAFSA® or MAFAA by MAR 1 every year
- If a student is ineligible to file a FAFSA[®] application but eligible for in-state tuition, complete the MSFAA by MAR 1 online through MDCAPS.
- Student must enroll at a two-year or four-year Maryland college or university as a full-time (12+ credits per semester), degree-seeking, undergraduate student.
- Be under the age of 22 at the time of the initial award

- Maintain Satisfactory

 Current high school seniors enrolled in college preparatory program that have an unweighted high school grade point average (GPA) of at least a 2.5

• Grant is renewable when FAFSA[®] is completed by March 1 each year.

Academic Progress (SAP)

Legislative Grants

DELEGATE:

The Delegate Scholarship Program is for delegates in the Maryland General Assembly to provide financial assistance to full-time and part-time students pursuing an undergraduate, graduate, or professional education.

SENATORIAL:

The Senatorial Scholarship Program is for senators in the Maryland General Assembly to provide financial assistance to full-time and part-time students pursuing an undergraduate, graduate, or professional education.

Must apply directly to YOUR delegates and/or senator.



Delegate Grant

- Student and parent must be a resident of Maryland.
- Student can be enrolled full-time, 12+ credits or part-time, 6-11 credits.
- Delegate will determine award amount based on enrollment status.
- Contact delegate in **FEB** for application.
- Grant is not renewable; you must re-apply each year.
- Each delegate has a different process, requirements and deadline dates.
- Must maintain satisfactory academic process to receive grant



Senatorial Grant


- Student and parent must be a resident of Maryland.
- Student can be enrolled full-time, 12+ credits or part-time, 6-11 credits.
- Senator will determine award amount based on enrollment status.
- Contact Senator in **FEB** for initial application.
- Senatorial Grant is renewable each year; you don't have to re-apply.
- Each senator has a different process, requirements and deadline dates.
- Must maintain satisfactory academic process to receive grant

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Maryland Part-Time Grant

- The Part-Time Grant Program provides funds to Maryland public and independent colleges and universities so they may provide grants to eligible part-time students.
- Must demonstrate financial need as determined by the completion of FAFSA®
- Student and parent must be resident of Maryland.
- Student must sign Drug-Free Policy form.
- Student must be enrolled in 6-11 credits in a degree-seeking program.
- Recipients are selected by institution.

Other State Grants

- Some state grants require the completion of an application to the state.
- Each grant has a "hard" deadline for submission of application and supporting documents.
- Some grants require completion of a FAFSA[®].
- Some grants are automatically renewable.
- Some grants are for degree-seeking students while others are for certificate programs leading to employment, licensure or job skill enhancement.



Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship Program

MD Community College Promise Scholarship

- Complete FAFSA® or MSFAA (MD State Financial Aid Application for eligible undocumented immigrants) by MAR 1
- Unweighted GPA minimum of 2.3 at the end of the first semester of your senior year in high school or at the end of your senior year in high school
- Annual 2018 adjusted gross income of not more than:
 \$100,000 if single or resides in a single-parent household
 \$150,000 if married or resides in a two-parent household

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MD Community College Promise Scholarship

- Enrolled full-time, 12+ credits at your local community college
- Be eligible for in-state tuition
- Pay for your own books
- Have not previously earned a bachelor's degree or an associate degree
- Enrolled in a credit-bearing vocational certificate, a credit-bearing certificate, or an associate degree; or enroll in a sequence of credit or noncredit courses that leads to licensure or certification; or in a registered apprenticeship program
- Submit all documentation, if required, to MHEC by JUNE 15, 2021

Renewal Requirements

A recipient of a Promise Scholarship is eligible for up to two years of a renewable award if the recipient continues to:

- Annually complete the FAFSA or MSFAA by MAR 1;
- Remain eligible for in-state tuition;
- Enroll in and complete either:
 - a sequence of credit or noncredit courses that leads to licensure or certification; or
 - 12 credits at the end of each semester in credit-bearing programs.

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- an associate degree;

• Maintain at least a 2.5 cumulative college GPA if enrolled in a credit-bearing program;

 Make satisfactory progress toward a vocational certificate, a certificate, or

 Participate in a registered apprenticeship program; and

• Meet the income requirements

Promise for Noncredit Students

APPLICATION PROCESS

For Promise Noncredit applicants only, an applicant must:

- Submit a FAFSA or MSFAA by MAR 1
- Complete the Promise Noncredit application online through MDCAPS - Rolling deadline for Promise noncredit applicants only
- Submit all required documents (initial applicants only) by the established deadline
 - High school or community college transcript
 - GED Examination
