WELCOME

The Maryland Higher Education Commission

- MHEC is the State of Maryland's higher education coordinating board responsible for establishing statewide policies for Maryland public and private colleges and universities and for-profit career schools. MHEC also administers state financial aid programs that affect students on a statewide basis.

- The Maryland Higher Education Commission has a variety of grants and programs available to a multitude of students.
- Some of the grants require an application and some do not.

State Grants Based on FAFSA Completion

- FAFSA® must be completed by MAR 1
- Rawlings Educational Assistance Grant
- Guarantee Access Grant
- Maryland College Promise Scholarship

Rawlings Assistance Grant

- **Complete the FAFSA® or MAFAA by March 1 every year.**
- If a student is ineligible to file a FAFSA® application but eligible for in-state tuition, complete the MSFAA by MAR 1 online through MDCAPS.
- Student must be eligible for in-state tuition.
- Student must enroll at a two-year or four-year Maryland college or university as a full-time (12+ credits per semester), degree-seeking, undergraduate student.
- Students must demonstrate financial need. All applicants are ranked by Expected Family Contribution (EFC). (Students with the lowest EFC are awarded first).
- Grant is renewable when FAFSA® is completed by March 1 each year.
- Must maintain minimum satisfactory academic progress.

Guarantee Access Grant

- **Complete the FAFSA[®] or MAFAA by MAR 1 every year**
- If a student is ineligible to file a FAFSA[®] application but eligible for in-state tuition, complete the MSFAA by MAR 1 online through MDCAPS.
- Student must enroll at a two-year or four-year Maryland college or university as a full-time (12+ credits per semester), degree-seeking, undergraduate student.
- Be under the age of 22 at the time of the initial award
- Current high school seniors enrolled in college preparatory program that have an unweighted high school grade point average (GPA) of at least a 2.5
- **Grant is renewable** when FAFSA[®] is completed by March 1 each year.
- Maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)



Legislative Grants

DELEGATE:

The Delegate Scholarship Program is for delegates in the Maryland General Assembly to provide financial assistance to full-time and part-time students pursuing an undergraduate, graduate, or professional education.

SENATORIAL:

The Senatorial Scholarship Program is for senators in the Maryland General Assembly to provide financial assistance to full-time and part-time students pursuing an undergraduate, graduate, or professional education.

Must apply directly to YOUR delegates and/or senator.

Delegate Grant

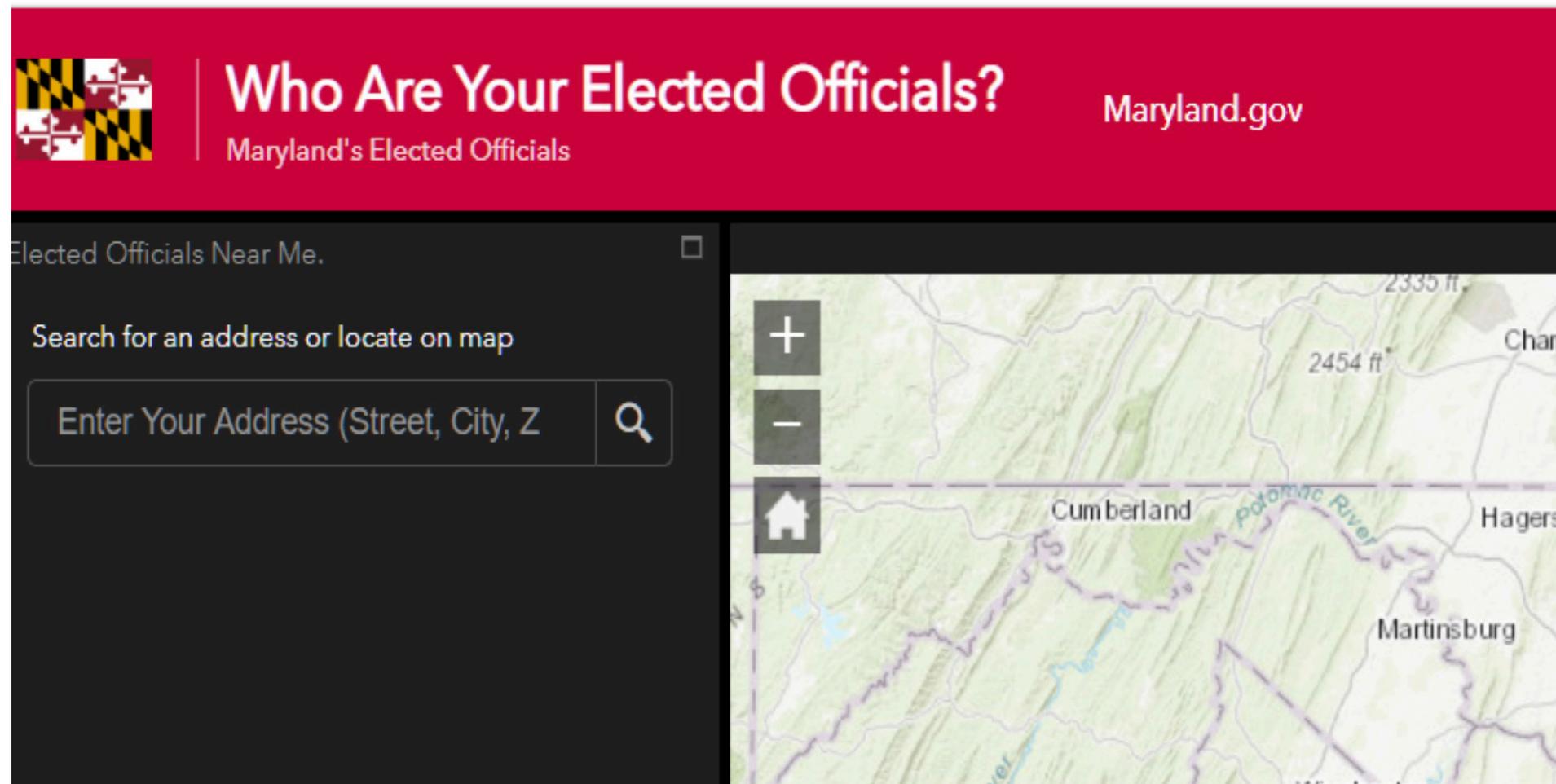
- Student and parent must be a resident of Maryland.
- Student can be enrolled full-time, 12+ credits or part-time, 6-11 credits.
- Delegate will determine award amount based on enrollment status.
- Contact delegate in **FEB** for application.
- **Grant is not renewable; you must re-apply each year.**
- Each delegate has a different process, requirements and deadline dates.
- Must maintain satisfactory academic process to receive grant

Senatorial Grant

- Student and parent must be a resident of Maryland.
- Student can be enrolled full-time, 12+ credits or part-time, 6-11 credits.
- Senator will determine award amount based on enrollment status.
- Contact Senator in **FEB** for initial application.
- **Senatorial Grant is renewable each year; you don't have to re-apply.**
- Each senator has a different process, requirements and deadline dates.
- Must maintain satisfactory academic process to receive grant

Maryland Part-Time Grant

- The Part-Time Grant Program provides funds to Maryland public and independent colleges and universities so they may provide grants to eligible part-time students.
- Must demonstrate financial need as determined by the completion of FAFSA®
- Student and parent must be resident of Maryland.
- Student must sign Drug-Free Policy form.
- Student must be enrolled in 6-11 credits in a degree-seeking program.
- Recipients are selected by institution.

Other State Grants

- Some state grants require the completion of an application to the state.
- Each grant has a “hard” deadline for submission of application and supporting documents.
- Some grants require completion of a FAFSA[®].
- Some grants are automatically renewable.
- Some grants are for degree-seeking students while others are for certificate programs leading to employment, licensure or job skill enhancement.

Tuition Waivers for Foster Care Students

Provide financial assistance to foster care youth.

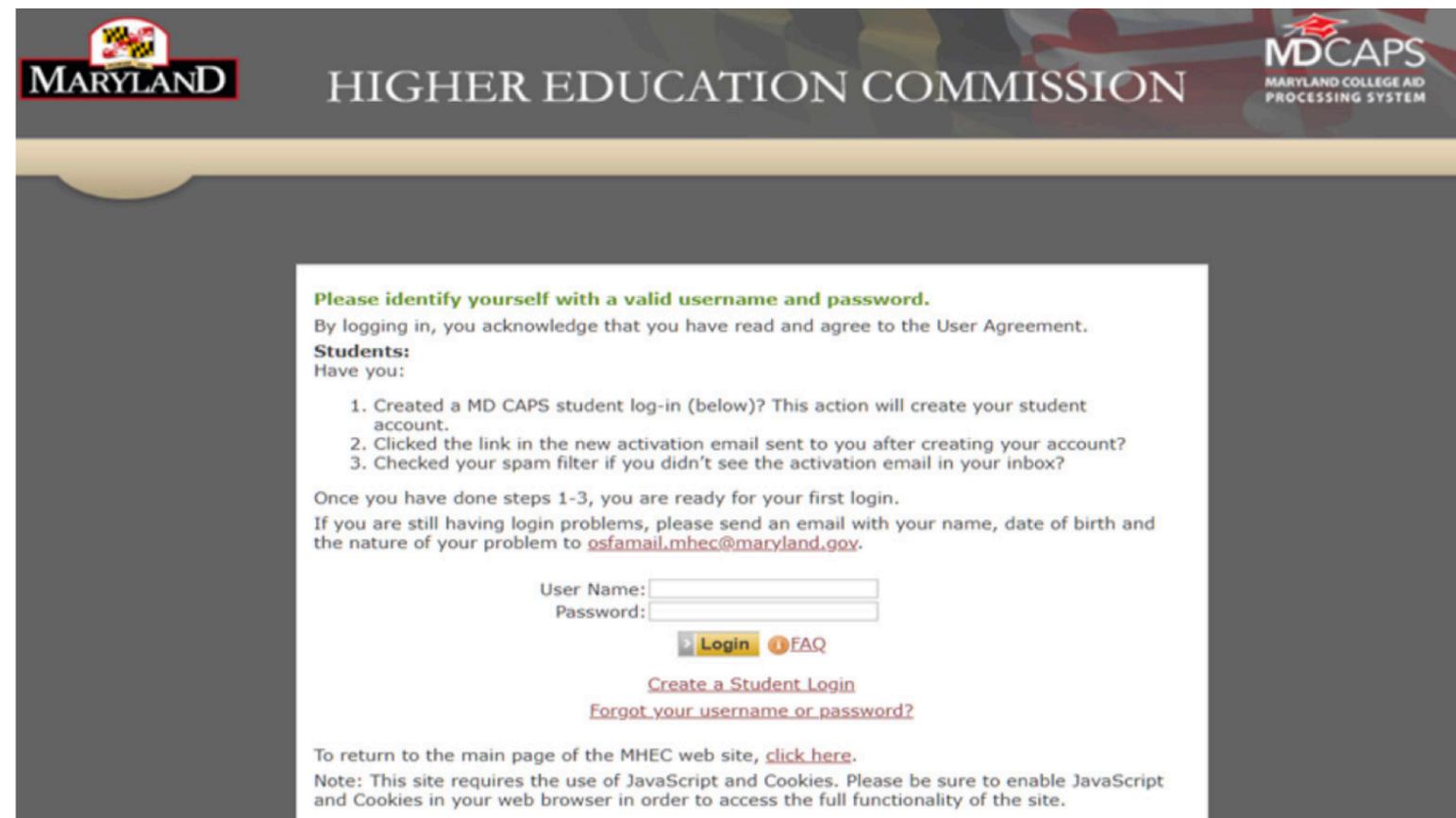
- Eligible students are under the age of 25 who are or were in an out-of-home placement in Maryland by the MD Department of Human Services.
- Resided in an out-of-home placement on the individual's 18th birthday or at the time of graduation from high school or upon successful completion of the General Education Development (GED) examination; **OR**
- Resided in an out-of-home placement for at least one year on or after the individual's 13th birthday and entered into guardianship, been adopted, or reunited with at least one of the individual's parents.

Tuition Waivers for Foster Care Students

- Student must compete FAFSA every year.
- Student must contact the Financial Aid Office of the institution they are planning to attend.
- Waiver will pay for tuition and fees
- Waiver will not pay for room and board, books or transportation.

MDCAPS (MD College Aid Processing System)

<https://mdcaps.mhec.state.md.us>

- Establish a login and password on MDCAPS website.
- Accept your grant(s) and tell the state the school you want to receive your grant(s).
- Will receive 3 emails and/or texts from state before grant is canceled.
- You have about 4 weeks to accept grant.
- If you don't accept your grant, it will be canceled by the state and you may go on a waitlist.

Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship Program

Free Community College?

- It's not that simple
- Criteria must be met
- Deadlines are firm
- Patience is required!

2020 Program Changes:

BEFORE:

- Graduate from a Maryland high school within the last two years or complete a GED
- Commit to working full-time in the state of Maryland for every year that you received the grant

Effective JULY 1, 2020, these requirements have been eliminated.

MD Community College Promise Scholarship

- Complete FAFSA® or MSFAA (MD State Financial Aid Application for eligible undocumented immigrants) **by MAR 1**
- Unweighted GPA minimum of 2.3 at the end of the first semester of your senior year in high school or at the end of your senior year in high school
- Annual 2018 adjusted gross income of not more than:
\$100,000 if single or resides in a single-parent household
\$150,000 if married or resides in a two-parent household

MD Community College Promise Scholarship

- Enrolled full-time, 12+ credits at your local community college
- Be eligible for in-state tuition
- Pay for your own books
- Have not previously earned a bachelor's degree or an associate degree
- Enrolled in a credit-bearing vocational certificate, a credit-bearing certificate, or an associate degree; or enroll in a sequence of credit or noncredit courses that leads to licensure or certification; or in a registered apprenticeship program
- **Submit all documentation, if required, to MHEC by JUNE 15, 2021**

Renewal Requirements

A recipient of a Promise Scholarship is eligible for up to two years of a renewable award if the recipient continues to:

- Annually complete the FAFSA or MSFAA by MAR 1;
- Remain eligible for in-state tuition;
- Enroll in and complete either:
 - a sequence of credit or noncredit courses that leads to licensure or certification; or
 - 12 credits at the end of each semester in credit-bearing programs.
- Maintain at least a 2.5 cumulative college GPA if enrolled in a credit-bearing program;
- Make satisfactory progress toward a vocational certificate, a certificate, or an associate degree;
- Participate in a registered apprenticeship program; and
- Meet the income requirements

Promise for Noncredit Students

APPLICATION PROCESS

For Promise Noncredit applicants only, an applicant must:

- Submit a FAFSA or MSFAA by MAR 1
- Complete the Promise Noncredit application online through MDCAPS
 - Rolling deadline for Promise noncredit applicants only
- Submit all required documents (initial applicants only) by the established deadline
 - High school or community college transcript
 - GED Examination

Renewal Requirements

A Noncredit recipient of a Promise Scholarship is eligible to receive the award for up to two years if the recipient continues to:

- Pass all courses taken in each term and enroll in the next available courses offered at the community college in the sequence
- Failure to enroll in the next available courses offered at the community college for the sequence will result in the applicant becoming ineligible for the award.
