

# General Information for this Face-to-Face, Online, or Combination Model\*

(\* <u>NEW for fall 2019</u> – Towson University is offering students the opportunity to choose the format for each course that works best for them.)

#### I. General Program Information

This dual enrollment option is available to eligible students once they are accepted to the Harford Community College (HCC) Nursing Program. Admission is competitive and based on completed courses and grade point average (GPA). Students will be enrolled as degree students at HCC and Towson University (TU) and begin to take TU courses during the Nursing Program at HCC. Once the Associate of Science (A. S.) Degree is awarded at HCC, students must take and pass the nursing licensure exam, the NCLEX-RN, and then continue coursework at TU to complete the Bachelor of Science (B. S.) Degree.

Program length is <u>9 terms, including winter and summer sessions</u>, and it takes approximately 2 ½ years to complete.

HCC courses will be held at the Harford Community College campus; TU courses will be taken on the Towson University North Eastern (TUNE) campus in Bel Air, Maryland.

Two degrees will be awarded: A.S. from HCC and B.S. from Towson University (where a <u>minimum of **30 credits** will be</u> <u>required</u> from TU to graduate with the B.S.).

Advisors will be available from both HCC and TU. Financial aid will be arranged through Towson University Office of Financial Aid.

#### **II. Program Admission Requirements**

- A. Admission to HCC Nursing Program (selective process based on courses completed, GPA, and test scores)
- B. GPA of 3.0 or higher in HCC required admission courses

Chemistry (CHEM 111)

- C. Additional required courses (completed by the start of the first nursing course) with a C or better:
  - 4 credits (must include a lab)
  - Nutrition (BIO 210) 3 credits

### **III. ATB Program Progression**

Students must be successful in <u>all required courses</u> to continue in the ATB option. Students are expected to complete the sequence of study as outlined in the Towson Univ. ATB curriculum plan. Students are required to meet regularly with their TU advisor to review their ATB curriculum plan. Students must successfully complete their associate degree prior to taking NURS 476 and NURS 484. Students must successfully pass the NCLEX-RN exam prior to taking NURS 489 (Practicum).

#### **IV. General Application Procedures**

Note: Students applying to the TU ATB Option must first be accepted to the HCC A.S. Degree Nursing Program. Admission to the TU ATB Option is contingent upon admission to HCC's Nursing Program. Students in HCC's Accelerated Nursing Program are not eligible for ATB.

All applications, fees and transcripts must be received by TU by the deadline of May 1<sup>st</sup> for a Fall start and by November 9<sup>th</sup> for a Spring start.

- 2. Pay the \$50 application fee (non-refundable).
- Submit official hardcopy or electronic transcripts from all colleges or universities attended. All official transcripts must be received by University Admissions by application deadline. Hardcopy transcripts should be sent directly to:

- 5. Student will be notified by either email and/or letter with admission decision.
