

## ATB 2.0

*The option for students to begin university courses in their first year of nursing at HARFORD.*



### **General Information for this Blended Option\***

#### **I. General Program Information**

This concurrent enrollment option is available to eligible students once they are accepted to the Harford Community College Nursing Program. Students are eligible to apply for the ATB program after successful completion of their first semester. Admission is competitive and based on completed courses and grade point average (GPA). Students will be enrolled as degree students at Harford Community College (HCC) and Stevenson University (SU) and begin to take SU courses during the Nursing Program at Harford Community College. Once the Associate of Science (A. S.) Degree is awarded at HCC, students must take and pass the nursing licensure exam, the NCLEX-RN, and then continue coursework at SU to complete the Bachelor of Science (B. S.) Degree.

HCC courses will be held at the Harford Community College campus; SU courses will be held online or (dependent on semester) in a hybrid-format through Upper Chesapeake Medical Center's nursing cohort.

Two degrees will be awarded: A.S. from Harford Community College and B.S. from Stevenson University (where a minimum of 30 credits will be required from SU to graduate with the B.S.).

Advisors will be available from both HCC and SU. Financial aid will be arranged through Stevenson University Office of Financial Aid.

#### **II. Program Admission Requirements**

- A. Admission to HCC's Nursing Program (selective process based on courses completed, GPA, and TEAS score)
- B. GPA of 3.0 or higher in HCC required admission courses

#### **III. ATB Program Progression**

Students must remain in HCC's nursing program and must be successful in all required courses to continue in the ATB option. Students are expected to meet regularly with their SU advisor to review their ATB curriculum plan.

Students are expected to complete the sequence of study as outlined in the SU ATB curriculum plan.

Students must successfully pass the NCLEX-RN prior to taking the SU NATB 424 - Health in the Community course.

#### **IV. General Application Procedures**

Students applying to the SU ATB Option must first be accepted to the HCC A.S. Degree Nursing Program. Admission to the SU ATB Option is contingent upon admission to HCC's Nursing Program.

Note: Students in HCC's Accelerated Nursing Program are eligible for ATB 3.0. Please contact Enrollment Counselor, Rachel Haywood, for more information.

4. Student will be notified by both email and mail with an admission decision.

Application processing requires 1-5 business days after all admissions materials are received.

Harford Nursing Students who are in the ATB Option are offered a 20% discount on SU’s tuition. Tuition is subject to change from one academic year to the next. There are no fees associated with SU’s ATB option.
